## Project 1: Sakhi, ONE STOP CENTRE, Tinsukia

### Objective:

- To provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces under one roof.
- To facilitate immediate, emergency and non-emergency access to a range of services including medical, legal, psychological and counselling support under one roof to fight against any forms of violence against women.

### Target beneficiary:

The OSC will support all women including girls below 18 years of age affected by violence, irrespective of caste, class, religion, region, sexual orientation or marital status. For girls below 18 years of age, institutions and authorities established under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 will be linked with the OSC.

**Target Area:** Tinsukia District of Assam

**Funding Agency:** District Administration, Tinsukia



## Project 2: Navarupantar Home for Special Need Children , Doomdooma, Tinsukia

### Objective:

- To rehabilitate Children in need of care and protection for their care, treatment, education, training, development, and rehabilitation.
- To provide them a creative opportunity and become useful member of the society.
- To provide them basic education and welfare services like free lodging, boarding, health and recreation.
- To promote recognition of the skills, merits and abilities of special children.
- To combat stereotypes, prejudices and harmful practices relating to persons with disabilities, including those based on sex and age, in all areas of life.

### Target beneficiary:

Special need children under 18 years of age

**Target Area:** Tinsukia District of Assam

**Funding Agency:** Self Funding and Donation



### **Project 3: Documentation and Publication of survey report base on monitoring and supervision of 1190 numbers of schools in the remote areas from different districts of Assam.**

**Objective:** The objective of the study is to analyse the educational facilities as well as management practices that are in the school level educational institutions in Assam by studying sample schools of 23 out of 33 districts of the state. The 23 districts covered are Barpeta, Biswanath, Bongaigaon, Chirang, Darrang, Dhemaji, Dibrugarh, Dima Hasao, Golaghat, Hojai, Jorhat, Kamrup, Karbi Anglong, Kokrajhar, Lakhimpur, Morigaon, Nagaon, Nalbari, Sibsagar, Sonitpur, Tinsukia, Udalguri and West Karbi Anglong district.

**Study Analysis:** 1) Schools and the status of students and teachers, 2) Boundary wall, 3) Toilet, 4) Drinking water, 5) Classrooms, 6) Quality learning, 7) Barrier free access, 8) Library, 9) Mid-Day Meal (MDM), 10) Enrolment status and grant to school; and 11) School management committee (SMC).

**Target Area:** 23 districts out of 33 districts of Assam

**Funding Agency:** Assam State Commission for Protection of Child Rights.

### **Project 4: A Study on Educational Status of Children of Migrant Labour**

**Objective:**

- To identify the children of migrant labourers.
- To identify the trends including pockets of migration, nature of migration.
- To identify the educational status of children of migrant labourers.
- To examine the impact of Covid19 on the children of migrant labourers.

**Focus Area:** 1) Reason of migration, 2) Socio-economic status, 3) Nature of work of migrant labourers, 4) Status of schooling/education of children, 5) Problems faced by the children of migrant labourers in schools/education institutions, and; 6) Practices and initiatives of governments to the children of migrant labourers in different states.

**Target Area:** Five zones of India (North, South, East, West and North East of India)

**Funding Agency:** National Commission for Protection of Child Rights.

## **Project 5: A study to examine the availability of hostels and the effectiveness of different schemes providing hostels to school children in preventing dropout in North-Eastern States**

### **Objective:**

- To identify different types of hostels functioning in the NE States for school children under different Central and State Government Schemes.
- To examine the enrolment, retention and dropout data of children in the hostels.
- To examine effectiveness of the hostels w.r.t helping children continue and complete their elementary education.
- To identify gaps and highlight good practices followed by the State.

**Target Area:** 8 states of NER of India (Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura, and Sikkim)

**Coverage and Sample:** The study covers 18% of the total hostels of elementary schools in the target areas under the following schemes: Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV), Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya (JNV), and Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRS). In total, 87 schools were selected for the study from across the region.

**Finding of the study:** The schools functioning under various schemes of Central and State governments have been affected by various factors such as low enrolment and high dropout of students, and this has reduced their effectiveness in fulfilling their mandated goal of helping children below 6-14 years in continuing and completing their elementary education.

**Funding Agency:** National Commission for Protection of Child Rights.

## Project 18: Distribution of relief to Flood & Landslide crisis people in Dima Hasao district, Assam

### FLOOD AND LANDSLIDES IN DIMA HASAO

As we all are aware about the havoc created due to incessant rains, landslides and floods in Dima Hasao District of Assam in the middle of months of May and June 2022. Railway line was completely paralysed in the district along the Lumding-Badarpur Hill Section of Northeast Frontier Railway, NH-27 (formerly, NH 54E) blocked, main roads connecting Haflong to Jatinga and Lower Haflong had sunken and cut off creating connectivity issues in the hilly district of Dima Hasao. Electricity supply and network was disrupted and communication had become difficult. There had been damages to many houses, property, paddy fields, farming lands and even livestock. As Dima Hasao is inhabited by different tribal groups, majority of them are financially poor and stay in far away areas. These people needed the helping hands.



### RELIEF DISTRIBUTION

As per the survey and report about 1200 families were affected by this natural calamity in Dima Hasao. Foundation for Integrated Support and Solution FISS after conducting extensive field survey by the members while accessing the extent of losses of the victims, distributed Ration Kits, candles and bleaching powder to 60 affected families and also provided solar lanterns to 17 affected families in the Kalachand area in Maibang subdivision of Dima Hasao district. The area was affected due to flooding of Mahur river and subsequent landslides

**Funding Agency:** North Eastern Development Finance Corporation Ltd (NEDFi)
